### **HBC's Secret Service**

At HBC it's estimated that around 75 members volunteer in a myriad of roles, for an average of around 3.5 hours per week. That's 75 volunteers x 3.5 hrs x 25 weeks = 6,563 hrs per season; at \$33 per hour (including on costs), the equivalent of a cash donation of \$216,563 per season.

Off-season, volunteer input is said to be around a further 20%, increasing the annual donation to \$259,876, roughly the equivalent of our current annual turnover!
