Code of Conduct for Members and Visitors

Introduction

The Mission Statement of the Hawthorn Bowling Club Inc (from here referred to as ‘the club’) is as follows:

“To provide a premier club for the sport of lawn bowls AND foster the friendships, personal life-enhancement, and community wellbeing the game engenders.”

In pursuit of our Mission Statement, the club is committed to fostering a positive and inclusive environment for all members and visitors. All individuals associated with the club are expected to adhere to this Code of Conduct which outlines the desired behaviour and standards of all members and visitors. By participating in club activities, on and off the green, all individuals agree to abide by this Code of Conduct to maintain a respectful and enjoyable atmosphere.

1 **Respect and Courtesy**

Members and visitors are expected to always treat others with respect and courtesy. This includes fellow members, opponents, officials and volunteers. Discrimination, harassment, bullying or any form of disrespectful behaviour will not be tolerated.

2 **Integrity and Fair Play**

All participants are expected to uphold the principles of integrity and fair play. Cheating, dishonesty or any form of unethical conduct is strictly prohibited. Members and visitors are encouraged to compete with a spirit of fairness and honesty.

3 **Inclusivity**

The club is committed to provide-an inclusive and welcoming environment for all individuals, regardless of age, gender, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, ability or disability. Discrimination of any kind is unacceptable and goes against the values of the club.

4 **Facility and Equipment Care**

Members are responsible for the proper care of the club facilities and equipment. Any damage caused intentionally, accidentally or through negligence should be reported promptly. Respect for the property and equipment of the club ensures a positive experience for everyone.

5 **Alcohol, Smoking, Vaping and Substance Use**

All members and visitors must abide by the statutory liquor licensing requirements displayed in the club and will respectfully adhere to staff discretion and direction regarding the serving of alcohol. Members and visitors are expected to drink responsibly and be mindful of the impact of their behaviour on bar staff and others.

The use of all illegal substances is prohibited.

The club is a non-smoking venue, and no smoking or vaping is permitted within five (5) metres of any entrance.

When children under 18 are on site then vaping and smoking are banned in all public areas within 10 metres of playing and viewing areas.

6 **Communication**

Open and respectful communication is key to maintaining a healthy club environment. Members are encouraged to express their opinions and concerns in a constructive manner, including verbal, written and digital.

Disagreements should be resolved through appropriate channels, avoiding public confrontations.

7 **Compliance with Rules and Regulations**

Members are expected to familiarise themselves with and adhere to all club rules and related association regulations, including but not limited to this Code of Conduct and all other club policies. The club Constitution, Bylaws, Policies and Procedures are posted on the club website and ignorance is not an excuse for non-compliance.

8 **Code Violations and Disciplinary Action**

Any violations of this Code of Conduct will be taken seriously. The club reserves the right to take appropriate disciplinary action as determined by the Board of Management, as outlined in the Constitution, Part II - Misconduct and Discipline, Clause 7.6.
